Fees: No player will be allowed to register with QC Soccer until all outstanding debts to the club are paid. ALL registration and fundraising fees must be paid prior to team tryouts. Please note that for those families with more than two children registering with the club, they will be given a 50% discount for their fees for each subsequent child they register.

Premier Fee: The premier teams (U14, U16 and U18) play a ½ field format as opposed to the usual ¼ field. The RSA charges each player an additional \$60. The team manager for the premier teams will collect this fee from players at the beginning of the season to pass on to the RSA.

Fundraising Fee: A \$100 fundraising fee will be assessed per player (maximum \$200 per family) at the time of registration. Details on this season's mandatory fundraising activity will follow. Players earn the fundraising fee back provided they participate in the club's fundraiser.

Late Registration Fee: A fee of \$40 will be charged to players registering after September 2nd. This fee will apply to any player U10 and up. Players new to our club are exempt.

Volunteer Bond: It is appreciated that many parents are busy, however the Club is dependent on the efforts of its members. It is expected that parents will commit to at least 2 hours of volunteer time for U6 and U8 and 4 hours of volunteer time for U10 and up in some capacity with the club for each child registered to a maximum of 8 hours or for two children.

Here are some ways in which you can volunteer:

- Board of Directors/Committees - board member, board committee member, Tournament Committee
- Team - team manager, assistant coach
- Club – QC tournament, in-person registration times, evaluations
- RSA - indoor provincials and other RSA events where the clubs are required to provide volunteers.

The club Volunteer Coordinator will periodically send out emails during the season, to inform members of upcoming volunteer opportunities. There will also be an online real time volunteer scheduling site that will be linked to the QC site in September.

For all players U6 and U8, a \$40 cheque, and for all players U10 and up, a \$80 cheque, post-dated to Feb. 1st, 2012, will be collected by the team manager before the beginning of the season. To work off your bond, you must volunteer for a minimum of two hours (U6/U8) or four hours (U10 and up) in one of the capacities mentioned above. If you do not work the required minimum hours, your cheque will be cashed. A maximum of two volunteer bonds per family or \$160 will be collected.

Refund of Fees: The Board of Directors must approve all refunds. Full or partial refunds shall be granted if:

- there is no age-appropriate QC team for the player; or
- a player is injured or is otherwise unable to play; or
- a player is released by the club; or
- a player moves out of the city

RSA Late Registration Date: All youth players who register after **Thursday, September 29th** must register at the RSA office. No registrations can be taken by the club after this date. You will pay only the RSA fees at that time. The balance of the club fees will be paid directly to QC, once the RSA office advises QC of the placement.

U8 –U10 late registrants will play within their home zone if there is till room on a team. Otherwise the RSA will attempt to find another club for the player.

U12 – U18 late registrants will be required to go through the RSA placement process which may take up to 5 business days. The placement committee will decide for which the club the player will play for the season.

Uniforms: Players will be supplied with one pair of socks, two jerseys and a pair of shorts. The socks are yours to keep. The jerseys and shorts must be returned at the end of the season. Extra socks will be available for purchase for \$10. Players must wear the full Club uniform, including socks, to all games.

In order to protect our investment in uniforms, a \$50 uniform deposit cheque, post-dated to February 1st, 2012 will be collected by the team manager. Players will not be supplied with a uniform until the deposit is received. These cheques will be returned when the uniform is returned in good condition at the end of the season. Failure to return the uniform in good condition will result in the cheque being cashed.

Player's Kit: A player's kit for practices consisting of shorts and 2 practice t-shirts (U10 and up) is provided once per calendar year at the beginning of the indoor season. Players who did not play the indoor season will receive their kit at the outdoor season.

Are there any other costs? Each team may wish to purchase team pictures, team clothing, enter tournaments or have a team windup at the end of the season. These are all additional costs to the player and will be collected by the team manager.

Commitment: All players are expected to commit to attend practices, games, tournaments, provincials and fitness sessions with their team. Attendance will be kept and playing time will be reduced for players not meeting the minimum attendance requirements.

Evaluations and Team Placement: Evaluation dates and times, as well as location, for each age group will be posted on the QC Soccer website. Please check often. Players returning from the previous season not attending evaluations will be placed based on the evaluation of the Club's Technical Director. New players not attending evaluations will be placed arbitrarily based on the needs of the teams.

Team rosters will be posted on the QC website as evaluations are completed. The player's registration number, not their name, is posted. New registrants can request this information from communications@qcsoccer.ca.
